Minutes June 10, 2024

- Meeting** The regular meeting of the Chateaugay Town Board on 06/10/2024 was called to order by Supervisor Donald Bilow at 6:30 P.M.
- Members Present** Supervisor Donald Bilow, Councilman William Trombly, Councilman Kirby Selkirk, Town Clerk Phyllis LeMay and Highway Superintendent Roger LaBombard. Councilman Scott Cowan and Councilman Jim Harrigan were absent.
- Visitors** Paige Beyer from Batclay Damon representing US Light Energy and Chasm Solar and Theater Director Heather Locklin.
- Minutes** A motion was made by Kirby Selkirk and seconded by Bill Trombly to adopt the minutes of the May 20, 2024, board meeting. All in favor, motion carried.
- Capital Projects** Bowling Alley - Supervisor Bilow reported that he reached out to John Carr from Blue Mountain Engineering to get an update as to when the bids for the bowling alley project would go out.
- Pool Controllers – Supervisor Bilow presented a proposal from Spaulding Pool & Spa for pool controllers.
- Resolution #28** A motion was made by Bill Trombly and seconded by Kirby Selkirk to approve Spaulding Pool & Spa proposal in the amount of \$15,783.77, pending approval by the New York State Department of Health. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: William Trombly – Aye, Scott Cowan – Absent, Jim Harrigan – Absent, Kirby Selkirk – Aye, and Supervisor Donald Bilow, Aye. Motion carried. Supervisor will reach out to the New York State Department of Health to get approval.
- Rec Park – Supervisor reported that everything is coming into place at the rec park for our summer program. We will be ready for opening on July 1.
- Jason Monette – Supervisor reported that Jason Monette is taking a Certified Pool Operator Course this week.
- Chasm Solar** Paige Beyer from Chasm Solar came before the Board to discuss the Host Community Agreement and the Pilot Agreement. The Town would prefer to have the Chasm Host Community Agreement unchanged.
- Contract** Supervisor Bilow reported that he spoke to Micky Smith and negotiations will begin on the highway department teamster’s contract soon. We will email Micky Smith to request the employee’s proposal so we can review it before the meeting.

Assessor A motion was made by Kirby Selkirk and seconded by Bill Trombly to approve Robert B. Ball as sole assessor for the Town of Chateaugay.
Resolution # 29 Mr. Ball will resume responsibility after the retirement of current assessor Amy Hewitt. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: William Trombly – Aye, Scott Cowan – Absent, Jim Harrigan – Absent, Kirby Selkirk – Aye, and Supervisor Donald Bilow, Aye. Motion carried.

Attendants A motion was made by Bill Trombly and seconded by Kirby Selkirk to approve raising 2nd year returnees in the position of rec park summer attendants by \$0.25, all in favor, motion carried.

Reports Roger LaBombard reported the following:


- Funds available: CHIPS - \$203,423.18, PAVE NY - \$47,377.49, EWR - \$40,656.43 and POP - \$31,584.99.
